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BLUEPRINT Project Kent Flat Recycling Survey Flats results – 29/09/2022

































About BLUEPRINT

- BLUEPRINT to a circular economy is an Interreg EU funded project with a budget of 5.6 million euro lasting from April 2020 to March 2023.
- Led by Essex County Council, the project seeks to enable local authorities to accelerate towards a circular economy.
- The Kent Flat Recycling Survey was developed and carried out by EcoWise, Kent County Council and the Kent Resource Partnership and its member councils in Kent.









BLUEPRINT Kent Flat Recycling Survey

The BLUEPRINT Kent Flat Recycling survey was developed to support councils across Kent to improve recycling in flats, with responses collected for two months between May and July 2022.

Why a flats recycling survey?

- To collect information on the recycling experience of Kent residents in flats and housing.
- To evaluate improvements to flats communal bin stores and their bin signage.

The survey was open and developed for all residents in Kent, including in flats and houses, as it was not possible to only filter out flat residents. The housing results are available in a separate report.










Overview of responses per council from flats and houses



Total survey responses

- 404 from flats
- 605 from houses

Note: the others six Kent councils had less than 10 respondents living in houses or flats and are not considered in the survey due to too few responses









Key insights from Kent flat residents #1

- On average, 50% of residents in Kent who live in flats across all councils use only the general waste bins, 31% use general waste and dry recycling bins and 19% use general waste, dry recycling and food waste bins.
- The main reason residents in flats do not recycle or use a food waste bin is that they
 do not receive a recycling or food waste collection service at their address.
- When asked if they would recycle if a recycling collection communal bin and service would be provided 98% of respondents said 'Yes', and 86% said 'Yes' to using a food waste bin if a food waste collection is provided.









Kent flat respondents recycling setup across councils in %

Of all Kent flat respondents half separate their dry recycling using a bin, bag or box and the other half only collect their waste in a general waste bin at home. One in five respondents use a food waste bin at home.

The main stated reason why people in flats do not use a food waste bin is because they do not receive a food waste collection service.

Q. Would you use a recycling collection service and a communal recycling bin if it was provided?

A share of 98% respondents said 'Yes' to using a communal recycling bin and recycling collection service if it was provided and 2% said 'No'.

A share of 86% respondents said 'Yes' to using a food waste bin and collection service if it was available and 14% said 'No'

Q. What would you do if you are not sure if an item is recyclable?

The main action taken when residents are not sure if an item is recyclable is to check the product label and the second most common action are to check the council's website.

Key insights from Kent flat residents #2

- A share of 62% of Kent Flat residents wished the communal bin areas were taken care of better and 59% stated they do not agree with the statement that the bins rarely overflow
- A share of 63% of residents said that they did not notice any improvements to their communal bin areas by their local Kent council, whilst 9% said they did notice improvements, and 28% said not sure.
- Of the Kent flat respondents a share of 54% said that they really liked the communal bin stickers and that the information is clear and will help them recycle. As the main feedback given 48% said that the information could include more recycling examples.









Q. Did you notice any improvements to the communal bin area?

A share of 9% of respondents said 'Yes' when asked if they noticed any improvement to their communal bin area, 63% said 'No' and 28% said 'not sure'.

A share of 62% of Kent Flat residents wished the communal bin areas were taken care of better and 59% stated they do not agree with the statement that the bins rarely overflow.

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Q. How do you feel about the new bin signage in your communal area?

A share of 72% of Kent Flat residents agreed stated that they have not see the new bin signage in their bin area, 55% agreed that they really like the signage and bin stickers and 54% agreed that the information is clear.

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Key insights from Kent flat residents #3

- A share of 50% of respondents who currently do not recycle said that bins
 designed to fit their flat would definitely help them start recycling, and 45% of
 respondents said they need a simple list of what is recyclable.
- A share of 76% of respondents who already recycle said that they need a simple list of what is recyclable to help them recycle more, and 66% of respondents said they need better examples of what is recyclable.
- A share of 24% from the respondents who are 'best-in-class' recyclers based on the survey said 'Yes' to the idea of discussing their ideas on improving recycling locally, 11% that they would be happy to run a recycling class, and 8% that they would do door-stepping.









Statements about what motivates flat residents to recycle

The majority of respondents state they are motivated to recycle to reduce pollution, because they have chosen to make recycling part of their daily activities or because they feel it is their duty.

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Ideas that will help flat residents to start recycling

Flat residents who do not recycle and only use a general waste bin were asked about four ideas if these can help them to start recycling. The two ideas residents responded positively to are bins designed to fit their flat and to be given a simple list of recyclable items that can be hung up in their flats.

Ideas to help flat residents who already recycle to recycle more

We asked flat residents who recycle in the groups of 'Doing my bit recyclers' and 'Wish recyclers' about seven ideas to help them recycle better. The main ideas respondents think will help is to be given a simple list of recyclable items, better examples and an easier way to get recycling bags for carrying the items to communal bins.

Responses to involvement in efforts to improve recycling in your flat or area

We asked flat residents who are 'best-in-class' recyclers if they would be keen to be more involved locally to support neighbours to recycle. A share of 24% said 'Yes' to discussing their ideas on improving recycling locally, 11% that they would be happy to run a recycling class, and 8% that they would do door-stepping.
